Kaohsiung Branch Expresses Concern for Obligors Affected by Torrential Rains and Implements Lenient Enforcement Measures

Due to the recent heavy rainfall brought by the southwestern air current, central and southern Taiwan have suffered severe flooding. In particular, mountainous areas in Kaohsiung have experienced continuous torrential rains and frequent landslides. To alleviate the burden on affected residents during the recovery of their homes, the Kaohsiung Branch of the Administrative Enforcement Agency, Ministry of Justice, upholds the core value of "Compassion in Enforcement, Justice Without Obstruction" by implementing the following lenient measures for affected obligors:

1. In administrative districts such as Maolin, Taoyuan, Liugui, Jiaxian, Namaxia, and Shanlin in Kaohsiung City, on-site enforcement operations will be temporarily suspended this week. In other districts experiencing flooding, enforcement will also be postponed to avoid interfering with residents' home recovery efforts.

- 2. If obligors have received a notice for payment or appearance, they may contact enforcement in charge officer to reschedule or visit the Kaohsiung Branch's official website (https://www.ksy.moj.gov.tw/) under the "Obligor Service" section to apply online for rescheduling or reissuance of the payment notice.
- 3. For obligors facing financial hardship and unable to pay in full, installment payment applications or requests to extend the number of installments can be submitted with relevant supporting documents. These will be handled leniently.
- 4. In cases of livelihood difficulties, the branch will assist in referring individuals to relevant social welfare agencies for emergency assistance, helping them to overcome this difficult time.
