## Kaohsiung Branch Hosts Special Volunteer Training for Ministry of Justice Southern Region on Father' s Day

The event, held on August 8, brought together volunteers from multiple agencies under the Ministry' s southern jurisdiction to strengthen their service dedication and professional skills.

The training for this year was designed for three key themes: cultivating a friendly service attitude, enhancing communication abilities, and fostering a strong sense of service identity. The comprehensive program received enthusiastic feedback from participants.

The event began with remarks from Director-General Miao, Jhuo-Ran of the Administrative Enforcement Agency and Kaohsiung Branch Director Yang Pi-Ying.

In alignment with the Ministry of Justice's National Environmental Education Action Plan, the program also incorporated an environmental education segment, featuring a screening of *“Flying Over Taiwan's National Parks”* followed by a cultural visit to the Weiwuying National Kaohsiung Center for the Arts. This immersive experience broadened volunteers' perspectives on sustainability and social responsibility.
